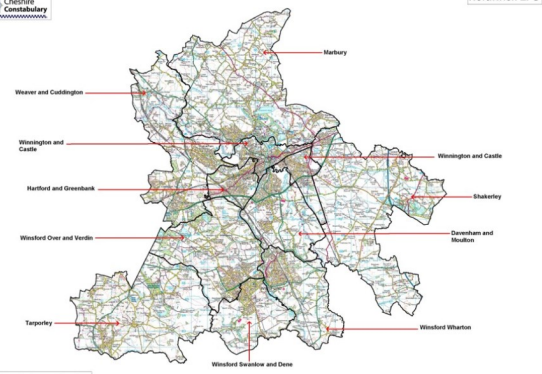

You said, We Listened, We Did.....

WEAVER and CUDDINGTON



You Said: Speed was a concern on A556 Chester Road, Sandiway/Cuddington.

We Did: Speed enforcement has been carried out on Chester Road. 3 offences were recorded, with the highest speed reaching 55 mph in a 40 mph zone. Video evidence has been prepared for the Central Ticket Office to progress further.

You Said: Speed concerns raised by residents on DELAMERE PARK.

We Did: A speed watch was conducted on Delamere Park Way West. The highest speed recorded was 29 mph. Police warning letters have been issued to registered keepers.

You Said: Due to the temporary outage of the SID and concerns raised by residents to the Weaverham Parish Chairman, speed enforcement has been conducted in the affected area.

We Did: The highest recorded speed was 38 mph. Video evidence has been processed and forwarded to the Central Ticket Office for further action.

You Said: Speed concerns raised on A49 Warrington Road (30mph zone).

We Did: Speed monitoring session in response to community concerns raised has been conducted. Four offences were captured, with the highest recorded speed being 38 mph. This evidence further supports your concerns. Further enforcement will be made.

You Said: Following on from the request from Weaverham Parish Council regarding the inoperative speed indicator device on Northwich Road, further speed enforcement has been conducted.

We Did: Speed enforcement conducted. Highest recorded speed: 37 mph. Video evidence processed, submitted to the Central Ticket Office for further action.

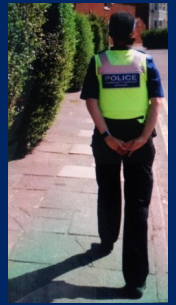

ASB

WEAVERHAM—3 incident(s)

Youths reported hitting golf balls into residential gardens, striking windows and causing residents to leave their gardens on a sunny day. PCSO conducted a patrol, identified the youths, and took all home. Feedback from both youths and parents highlighted a lack of local play facilities and financial barriers to participation in existing activities. PCSO has applied for funding for a summer 2026 programme aimed at providing FREE, inclusive, structured activities to reduce ASB for children aged 02-16 across NORTHWICH and WINSFORD.

Concerns raised about off-road and scrambler bikes being ridden dangerously in WEAVERHAM. These incidents often involve riders without helmets. Ongoing patrols being made by officers.

Report regarding anti social parking on WALNUT AVENUE received. PCSO to make regular patrols and issue fixed penalty notices to vehicles causing unnecessary obstructions.

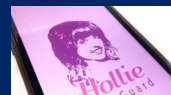

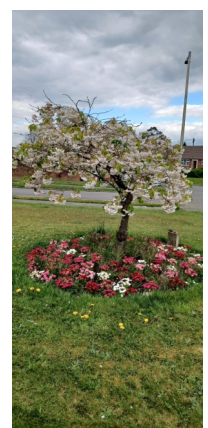

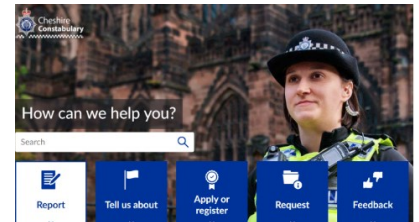
