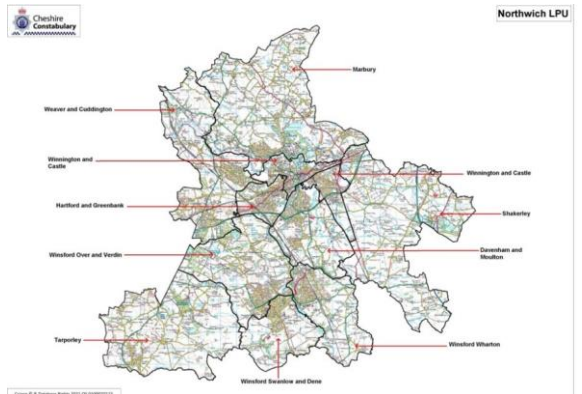

Community Speedwatch

CSW initiative is designed to help manage and reduced speeding in our area. By using speed detection equipment at the roadside, volunteers like you can play a crucial role in making our streets safer.

How It Works -

- Volunteers are trained and supported by the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs).
- You'll use a speed gun to monitor traffic speeds.
- Vehicle details of those exceeding the speed limit are recorded.
- Drivers of speeding vehicles receive warning letters.

Engagement

Licensing letter have been hand delivered to all licensed premises within our ward as part of our Op Jingles operation in line with statutory Licensing Objectives, how we can jointly address important issues, amongst other things:

- Recognising and addressing vulnerability from excessive/binge drinking and ensure strict adherence to the Licensing Act.

- Be alert to both vulnerable females and those potentially preying upon them in and around licensed premises.
- Briefing staff and having plans in place to support and safeguard anyone found to be vulnerable.
- Having effective plans to deter, identify and report incidents of 'spiking'.

Further to this, officers have conducted licensing checks at various licensed premises across our ward. Pleased to report all was in order.

This month marked the launch of the Embrace Café at The Lighthouse, Church Street, Weaverham! This initiative provides a welcoming drop-in space for people affected by dementia and their carers, fostering community and support. Held every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month, from 2 PM to 4 PM. At The Lighthouse, Church Street, Weaverham, CW8 3NJ. Herbert Protocol forms have been made available by the local police beat team. These forms are crucial for providing key information to help locate individuals living with dementia if they go missing. For help completing these forms or other assistance, contact your PCSO.

WEAVER and CUDDINGTON Beat Team have dedicated a shift to visiting elderly and vulnerable members of our community, checking on their well-being during the festive season. Home visits ensures that no one feels lonely or overlooked during this special time of year.

SAFEGUARDING

The Herbert Protocol is a safeguarding measure designed to help locate and protect vulnerable individuals, particularly those with dementia, in the event they go missing. It involves gathering detailed personal information, including medical history, a photograph, and details of places the person may be familiar with, to assist the police and community in finding them quickly and safely.

This proactive approach can be crucial in ensuring the safety and well being of those living with dementia.

If you know someone who could benefit from having a Herbert Protocol form completed, especially if they are living with dementia or another condition that makes them vulnerable to going missing , contact your PCSO for assistance to complete -

Did you see the recent alert sent by our Crime Prevention Team? The alert included lots of advice about personal safety, which I have summarised below:

1. When going out you should always plan how you are going to get home.
2. Prepare for your day before you leave and consider what you might need. Phone, money etc.
3. Update someone on your plans and always make sure someone is aware of where you are.
4. Plan your journey. Google street view is useful for identifying places in an unknown area before you set off.
5. When it gets dark, keep to busy, well-lit streets, walkways and paths.
6. Be aware when using cash point machines. If there are signs of tampering or people acting suspiciously, do not use it.
7. Try not to keep all your valuables in one place.
8. Only take licensed taxis or minicabs booked by phone or a mobile phone app.
9. Installing an app such as [Hollie Guard – Personal Safety App](#) on your smart phone or consider carrying a personal alarm.
10. Confidence - you are less likely to be targeted if you look confident.

If you haven't already, please share this or the crime prevention alert with friends, family, and neighbours. As always, thanks for your continued support.

As Christmas is approaching here are some handy tips to keep your home safe.

- Make your home looked lived in – When out and about use a timer switch to turn lights on and off
- External security lighting – Illuminate areas that burglars may use to hide.
- Look after deliveries – If you are not going to be home for a delivery, ask a neighbour to take in your parcel

- Lock up – When not at home, even just popping to the shops, make sure all windows and doors are locked.
- Do not hide keys under the plant pot or door mat – Use a key safe or install a keyless access.
- Letterbox fishing – Keep keys away from letterboxes, out of view and stored in a safe place.
- Social media – Thieves often trawl social media, be mindful of what you post and do not let people know when you are away from the home.
- Keep cash in the bank – Do not keep large amounts of cash in the home.
- Keep calendars out of sight – Burglars can look through the window and see when your home will be empty
- Don't leave presents under the tree – Burglars may see presents under the tree and identify you as a potential target.
- Recycle packaging – Packaging can be an indicator that you have expensive items in the home and make you a target.
- Garden and garage security – Make sure you still check your garage even though you may not be using it as regularly.
- Hide expensive gifts – Burglars will look for the 'big ticket' items and target homes specifically for these items.
- Speak to your neighbours – Looking at joining NHW will provide extra eyes on your home. Ask trusted neighbours to take bins out or turn lights on and off if you are away on holiday.
- Use your house alarm – Even if you are out of the house for a short period, burglars are often efficient at what they do and can target your home in this time.
