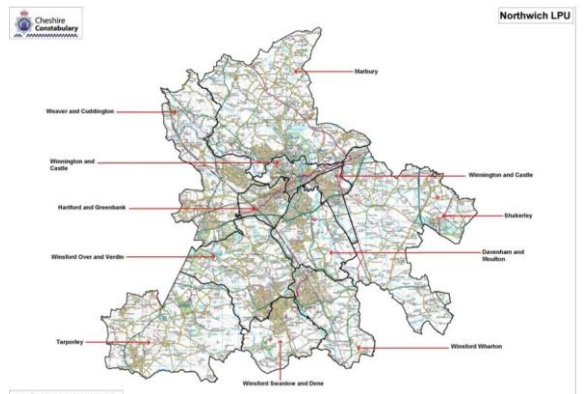

You said.... speed was a concern on WALLERSCOTE ROAD

We did ... speed enforcement and the highest recorded speed captured being 40 mph. Video evidence has been processed for central ticket office to progress further.

You said....speeding was also a concern on DENEHURST PARK WAY, NORLEY ROAD, ACTON LANE)

We did To address this, we have monitored and observed roads identified as problematic. Police warning letters will be issued to the registered keeper of vehicles found exceeding speed limits.

You said.... and parking was a concern across our ward (BRIDGE CLOSE, CHILTON CLOSE, ASH ROAD, CHERRY LANE).

We did We have assessed parking concerns implementing appropriate measures to enhance road safety for all.

Speed enforcement has also been conducted on NORTHWICH ROAD WEAVERHAM twice following concerns raised by local residents.. Trucam enforcement detected 5 speeding offences, with the highest speed recorded being 40 mph. The captured video evidence has been processed and forwarded to the central ticket office for further action.

So far, 4 Resident Voice surveys have been received throughout NOVEMBER for the entire ward.

Community Speedwatch

CSW initiative is designed to help manage and reduced speeding in our area. By using speed detection equipment at the roadside, volunteers like you can play a crucial role in making our streets safer.

How It Works -

- Volunteers are trained and supported by the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs).
- You'll use a speed gun to monitor traffic speeds.
- Vehicle details of those exceeding the speed limit are recorded.
- Drivers of speeding vehicles receive warning letters.

In the early hours of darkness, report received that 2 unknown males broke into a property before trying to steal vehicle parked on driveway. Unknown males disturbed before making of on foot in unknown direction. CSI attended for possible identification; CCTV enquiries also made.

We're appealing for witnesses and video footage following burglary at an address on Longmeadow in Weaverham. At around 12.30am on Tuesday 5 November two unknown offenders forced entry into an address on Longmeadow and stole the keys to a high-powered vehicle which was parked outside the house. SAFEGUARDING

The Herbert Protocol is a safeguarding measure designed to help locate and protect vulnerable individuals, particularly those with dementia, in the event they go missing. It involves gathering detailed personal information, including medical history, a photograph, and details of places the person may be familiar with, to assist the police and community in finding them quickly and safely.

This proactive approach can be crucial in ensuring the safety and well being of those living with dementia.
