

DAVENHAM AND MOULTON

November 2024 - (1st October to 31st October)

Officers conduct OPERATION to cover ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB) issues around the community.

Over the HALLOWEEN season NORTHWICH POLICE put in place an operation to have patrols in place to prevent / stop ASB issues around the NORTHWICH AREA.

This will include, Response Officers, Specials and Community Police Officers. These officers was out within the community in police vehicles, undercover vehicles and partner agency vehicles (such as Fire and CWAC), and would be solely answering any ASB incidents that would be report via members of the public to 101 / 999.

Within the DAVENHAM AND MOULTON community (which also includes, Kingsmead, Leftwich, Weaver Hall and Bostock), there was only 4 issues reported which are below.

LEFTWICH

OPERATION TREACLE REPORTS

- Report in regards to YOUTHS throwing fireworks at the building— OPERATION in order due to HALLOWEEN / BONFIRE NIGHT, patrols in place (see below)
- Report in regards to a vehicle driving around setting off fireworks—
 (See Below)
- 2nd report in regards to vehicle shooting fireworks out of vehicle—
 OPERATION TREACLE in order, patrols dispatched. Driver stopped and given a SECTION 59
- Report of fireworks being set off in a field by youths—OFFICERS on the operation dispatched, including PSCO ROBERTSON. Search made of the area and no trace of youths. PCSO ROBERTSON patrolled area and spoke to all youths who were known to him for causing issues. Possibly issue here was that YOUTHS were setting fireworks off in a field but not making sure they were secure.

Although there was 4 reports, there was only 2 issues as there first 3 reports were all linked to the Vehicle throwing fireworks out of window. PCSO ROBERTSON has been shown CCTV of the issue that the vehicle was causing and is seeking to take further action, even though a SECTION 59 has been issued.

WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report asking for a WELFARE CHECK in regards to partner wanting to stay out drinking—Not a police matter
- Report in regards to an ongoing neighbour issue, as neighbour has been seen videoing the reporting persons home—SAFEGUARDING ADVICE, PCSO ROBERTSON is aware of the issue
- Report of Two Females arguing and getting involved in a fight—RESPONSE DISPTACHED—FEMALE ARRESTED
- Further report in regards to an ongoing neighbour issue as reporting person received a phone call from the other party asking "WHY DO YOU HATE ME SO MUCH" - PC BAXTER attended in PCSO ROBERTSON absence, safeguarding advice given, nothing criminal, so no further action
- Report from AMBULANCE seeking assist in regards to female hurting herself—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

- Report of youths entering building site and pushing over CCTV cameras—crimed
- 2nd report of YOUTHS gaining access to building site and damaging CCTV cameras—Crimed , PCSO to contact reporting person to see if there is CCTV of the youths

LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report of an assault at school, in which VICTIM has been attacked and suffered a broken ankle—being passed to RESPONSE OFFICERS to deal with
- Report of a neighbour fightinging with partner—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched
- Report of a someone taking a possible overdose—AMBULANCE alerted and person taken to hospital
- Report in regards to abusive and threatening messages received in regards to the murder in RUDHEATH—RESPONSE officers spoke to reportin person, the messages were not sent to the reporting person, but clarified that there is no issue from the person who sent the messages. PCSO ROBERTSON to call for reassurance
- Report in regards to aggressive driving and following reporting person home and shouting "I know where
 you live " PCSO ROBERTSON to call round for reassurance
- Report over concern due to a female walking down driveway looking scared which was caught on CCTV— PCSO to call round to view the CCTV
- Report over a way that a dog has been treated by its owner, Report has come from a third party not the
 witness—PCSO ROBERTSON has spoken to all parties, PC ASHTON (Rudheath) is looking into
 this
- Report of threatening messages being received in relation to an incident that may or may not have happened—PCSO ROBERTSON to call for reassurance
- Report of an assault between parties who were in a relationship—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched
- Report of a suspicious vehicle along with a digger lifting up a manhole and cutting a cable, therefore
 affecting water supply—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched
- Report in regards to concern over a female, as upset after loosing her dog—PCSO ROBERTSON to complete a welfare check as he is aware of the female.
- Report in regards to reporting persons son being spiked at a party -

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

• Further damage to the surrounding area of the LEFTWICH COMMUNITY BUILDING, as the Electricity unit door has been damaged—CRIMED, no CCTV

THEFT

• Report of a bike being stolen —CRIMED , information has been passed to PCSO ROBERTSON in regards to this

KINGSMEAD

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report in regards to YOUTHS knocking and running from an address and causing a disturbance—
 REPORTING PERSON states that YOUTHS not in area anymore—PCSO ROBERTSON to call for reassurance
- Report of possible harassment from neighbour due to a parking dispute—PCSO ROBERTSON is dealing with the issue and looking into the possible parking dispute.
- Report of a woman screaming and banging—AMBULANCE called and COMMUNITY TEAM (PCSO ROB-ERTSON looking into this)
- Report from reporting person over their own mental health—not a police issue , AMBULANCE advised
- Report in regards to a potential suspicious vehicle—PCSO ROBERTSON to call round for more information

PARKING OBSTRUCTIONS

Report of parking issues on WYNDHAM CLOSE which are caused by students—PCSO Spoke to reporting
person and stated that patrols are occurring and that not all issues are being caused by students,
but if there is an obstruction it will be looked at and dealt with

DAVENHAM

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of male hitting head on a wall, after smashing a window and shouting abuse—MALE ARRESTED—PCSO ROBERTSON to call round for reassurance
- Report from a third party in regards to a conversation that occurred with a client. The client spoke about a
 neighbour dispute about noise and that a knife was involved, but had no intention of using it—PCSO ROBERTSON is aware of this incident and INTEL as been logged when first notified. NORTHWICH POLICE
 are also alerted to this.
- Report of a possible child being left on their own in a vehicle—Placed in as INTEL

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

• Report of on going parking obstruction on HARTFORD ROAD—PCSO FAULKNER (Winnington / Northwich Town Centre) spoke to Reporting Person who stated that PCSO ROBERTSON is dealing with the issue. Neighbours were not in when PCSO ROBERTSON attended

MOULTON

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of an issue where a naked man comes to his window when there are people outside waiting for the bus—there is no contact information (reporting person) so that PCSO ROBERTSON can get times / days this happens. The area has been placed on patrol plan.
- Report of a male being drunk and shouting at the reporting persons door—RESPONSE officers
 dispatched—MALE ARRESTED—PCSO ROBERTSON to call at the address for reassurance and
 to contact housing officer in regards to this.
- Report of a potential ROAD RAGE incident—there was no details given when report came in so there
 was no lines of enquiry—PCSO ROBERTSON to call for reassurance
- Report of a female smashing up house due to her mental state. AMBULANCE has been called— RESPONSE officers will assist if required, but is a health issue and AMBULANCE on route
- Report of two children being located in a persons shed, asked how they got there, they replied it was UNLOCKED—RESPONSE DISPATCHED, searched area, no trace of kids

BOSTOCK

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

 Report of a carer being aggressive and not leaving the property when asked—Reporting person just wants it logged—PCSO ROBERTSON will still call for reassurance

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

* Report of a possible drunken driver from the AA , as car broke down and customer rang up who sounds heavily intoxicated—**RESPONSE** dispatched and driver arrested from being over the limit

PCSO ROBERTSON VISITS DAVENHAM RAINBOWS AND DAVENHAM CofE PRIMARY SCHOOL

PCSO ROBERTSON together with PC EDGERTON attended DAVENHAM METHODIST CHURCH to visit the DAVENHAM RAINBOWS.

PCSO ROBERTSON and PC EDGERTON (Winsford) explained what the POLICE from , working with the community , helping and protecting people and what happens if you are in trouble with the police. Once the talk was over , PC EDGERTON then let the rainbows try out the different types of Police Uniform and PCSO ROBERTSON shown of the POLICE VAN, letting them go into the cell and turning on the police lights and sirens.

All of the Rainbows loved the visit, in which a thank you card was sent to Northwich Police station.

A couple of days after that another visit was made to DAVENHAM PRIMARY SCHOOL and visited the RECPETION CLASS.

PCSO FERRERIA (Winsford) joined PCSO ROBERTSON and PC EDGERTON. Together all provided the children the same talk and interaction as they did with the Davenham Rainbows, but this time brought along the Fin gerprint kit and spoke about how criminals leave traces of their DNA, especially fingerprints and completed an activity in which all completed a fingerprint marking activity.

The Knife surrender bin helps people within the community dispose of knives safely. In the past if residents with the community had knives to dispose of they would have to take them to the nearest recycling center or police station. Now with the help of social media / phones, if there is any residents who have any knives they need to dispose of they can now contact their local PCSO and arrange for the KNIFE BIN to be taken to them.

PARKING PATROLS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY

Over the past couple of months there has been a range of issues that relate to parking that has reported to PCSO ROBERTSON. With this patrols have been put into place around areas that have been reported. The issues include:

- PARKING ON A FOOTPATH—parking on a footpath is allowed AS LONG AS a wheelchair / pram user can still get passed.
- COMPLETE OBSTRUCTION OF A FOOTPATH
- PARKING TOO CLOSE TO A JUNCTION
- PARKING ON A BEND

As these are new issues in certain areas, advisory tickets were issued, but however registration numbers were taken down and further issues will result in FIXED PENALTY NOTICES BEING GIVEN.

- Speed Monitoring on CLIFTON DRIVE / DUNHAM ROAD / LONDON ROAD (30MPH SECTION) and LIME AVE—Speed Camera Sessions will be up and running soon
- More Visibility around WOODPECKER DRIVE area / GRANVILLE ROAD area
- Extend the school parking patrols to WOODSIDE TERRACE area— is now included in the school parking patrols
- . Issues with OFF ROAD BIKES— Owner of the BIKE has been spoken to and warned if witnessed again, bike may be seized
- More PATROLS around the play parks due to ASB— CCTV is now in place and no new issues since last newsletter (SEPT)
- More patrols around the shops due to ASB issues CLIFTON DRIVE IS NOW CLASSED AS A HOTSPOT DUE TO ISSUES THAT
 HAVE BEEN REPORTED AND PATROLS ARE NOW IN PLACE WITH YOUTHS BEING ASKED TO MOVE ON
- Leftwich building needs to be patrolled more —Building is now up for sale and building is more secure—Feedback from residents is that issue has died down
- Provide something for the youths to be involved in —this is being looked into as we use to have a YOUTH CLUB operating in MOULTON but we just need a building to hold something and put something on

KINGSMEAD

- Parking patrols on REGENCY WAY just after the ROUNDABOUT—Parking patrols have been conducted by MINI POLICE
- Speed Monitoring on REGENCY WAY and DUKES WAY—Will be included in the MINI POLICE PROGRAM
- School Parking patrols extend to MONARCH DRIVE—Now included in the school parking patrol
- More Patrols around REGENCY WAY RETAIL PARK
- Littering from the students that attend SIR JOHN DEANES—this will be looked into by the MINI POLICE
- Anti Social Behaviour issues around the community—THERE HAS BEEN SOME ISSUES WITH ASB WHICH ARE BEING LOOKED INTO DUE TO IT BEING REPORTED TO 101
- Parking patrols around WYNDHAM CLOSE— Parking patrols are taking place
- Parking near KING EDWARDS CLOSE —Parking patrols are now taking place—one resident has been spoken to in regards to parking
- (OCT) PARKING ON DROPPED KERBS around the BICKLEY CLOSE area— Parking patrols now in place

DAVENHAM

- Speed Monitoring on MOUNT PLEASANT / FOUNTAIN LANE / LONDON ROAD (20 MPH SECTION) / HARTFORD ROAD) and CHURCH ROAD at commuter times

- Parking on LONDON ROAD and LABURNUM ROAD—Any issues witnessed on LONDON ROAD will be issued with FIXED PEN-ALTY TICKETS as it's the main road PCSO ROBERTSON uses to get to MOULTON. So LONDON ROAD is being patrolled. LABURNUM ROAD is a private road so parking can not be addressed.
- Vehicle blocking / obstructing junction—PRITCHARD DRIVE— no issues since last newsletter (SEPT)
- 20MPH Signage is in the wrong areas as there is a lot of speeding in the area —We are in the process of restarting community speed watch
- ASB in the MERE BANK AREA— No issues reported to 101
- (OCT) PARKING on footpaths on LONDON ROAD—PATROLS are in place and any issues witnessed are addressed

MOULTON

- Speed Monitoring on MAIN ROAD / WHITLOW LANE
- Speed Gun Sessions not just JACK LANE
- More Rural crime involvement especially with the Badger sets—Rural Crime unit issue

Each year the ceremony is attended by HIGH COURT JUDGES, DISTRICT JUDGES, MAGISTRATES, CHIEF CONSTABLE OF CHESHIRE POLICE, POLICE CRIME COMMISSIONER and THE HIGH SHERRIF OF CHESHIRE.

Within the Ceremony the HIGH SHERRIF (CLARE HAYWARD) was conducting a speech about the good work that CRIMEBEAT has done for the young children within CHESHIRE. CRIMEBEAT is a charity that raises money from the proceeds of crime and then is funded to the community. They were the initial funders who got the MINI POLICE up and running in NORTHWICH and with that and the positive news and feedback that CLARE had heard about the KINGSMEAD MINI POLICE, they were invited to attend the ceremony.

At the ceremony the MINI POLICE met with HIGH JUDGES and representatives from the legal system and had a little photo shoot with them.

At 1115 there was a procession from CHESTER TOWN HALL to the CATHEDRAL which included PCSO ROBERTSON and the MINI POLICE and then at 1130 the ceremony took place. The MINI POLICE were invited up and speak about the program, Why they joined and What they enjoyed about the program.

After the ceremony the MINI POLICE and family were invited back to the hall town for refreshments , and the general feedback at the town hall was that they were the stars of the show.
