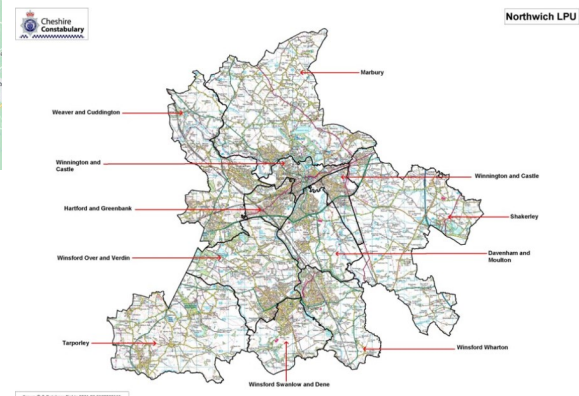

ARSON

WEAVERHAM— 1 incident(s) - report of youths playing football at BOTTOM PITCH MEADOW before making off in unknown direction after residents extinguished a fire. A vehicle also seen leaving the location at the same time as the youths. No evidence that youths lit the fire as not actually seen or if this vehicle was involved. Identification of local youths leaving the scene has been made by PCSO, passing attention will continue in location to provide reassurance to the community. No further arson incidents reported.

ASB

WEAVERHAM— 2 incident(s) - report received regarding unknown youths entering derelict unsafe property on private land off WALLERSCOTE ROAD. PCSO attended obtaining 4 x year 11 males personal details from the local high school. Unfortunately all youths provided incorrect details. However, due to body cam footage identification of these youths is ongoing so all can be spoken to in the company of their parents. Land owner has been contacted and a coded gate lock has been put in place, secured fencing around perimeter and KEEP OUT signs as deterrents.

Reports received regarding off road motorbike accessing the farmers land behind WALNUT AVENUE, WEAVERHAM near to GREENPARK. Regular patrols made, Appropriate action including S59 will be issued to rider if witnessed.

BURG—dwelling

CUDDINGTON — 1 incident (s) - report of unknown female believed to be selling cleaning products knocking on doors on WEAVERHAM ROAD. Later the home owner has discovered her purse missing. Officers deployed on scene within minutes, search made for the female, no trace. PCSO continued search around CUDDINGTON ward GREEN-FIELD WAY, NORLEY, FOREST, CHESTER, WEAVERHAM, ASH, MANOR, GRANGE ROADS, MERE, BLAKE, MOSS, VALLEY, TRICKETT, SCHOOL LANES, GOLDEN NOOK ESTATE, POPLAR, CHILTON, COSWORLD CLOSES again search made no trace. No further reports received.

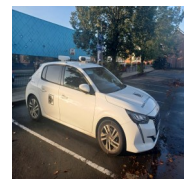

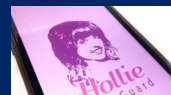
PARKING

A parking patrol conducted around The Russett School. During the patrol, a Fixed Penalty Notice was issued to a vehicle found blocking the footpath and obstructing wheelchair access. Traffic management was carried out by PCSO Michelle to ensure pedestrians could safely pass the vehicle.

PATROLS

Youths made off from PCSO Michelle at BOTTOM PITCH MEADOW, OWLEY WOOD on bikes and one on foot wearing a pink t-shirt on 13/05/25 it appears they left behind personal belongings on the bench. Litter has been properly disposed of, and tobacco products has been seized.

PCSO Michelle has also engaged with the farmer who owns the land behind Walnut Avenue, where crops are grown, following concerns about unauthorised access of motorcross biker and individuals using metal detectors. We kindly remind residents and visitors to respect the farmer's horticultural land, as it is his livelihood and vital to the local community. Further patrols will be conducted in the area to offer reassurance and deter unauthorised access. Thank you for your cooperation.

SAFETY ADVISE

Water Safety Advice – Please Take a Moment to Read

Your safety around water is extremely important. Whether you're at the beach, pool, lake, or river, please keep the following tips in mind:

Always supervise children around water – even shallow areas.

Never swim alone – use the buddy system.

Avoid alcohol when swimming or operating boats.

Wear a life jacket when boating or in open water if you're not a strong swimmer.

Check the weather and water conditions before entering.

Know your limits – don't push yourself too hard.

Learn CPR and basic rescue techniques – it could save a life.

Watch for currents and tides – they can change quickly and be dangerous.

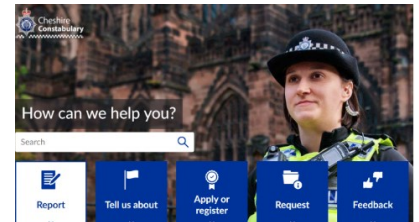
