You said, We Listened, We Did.....

WEAVER and CUDDINGTON

You Said: You Said speeding was a concern on Wallerscote Road (near the golf course).

We Did: Highest speed recorded: 42 mph, Northwich Road – Highest speed recorded: 33 mph, Norley Road – Highest speed recorded: 41 mph. 4 offences were captured, and evidence is being processed for further action by the central ticket office.

You Said: PARKING was a concern on MILTON ROUGH.

We Did: PARKING patrol was conducted to provide reassurance to the community.

You Said: We Did: Parking Enforcement and Engagement Initiative

In collaboration with CWAC Safety Officers and PCSO.

Target Areas:

Around Cuddington Primary School, St Bede's Catholic Primary School, The Russet School, Weaverham Academy, Weaverham High School and Acton Bridge station road.

Key Actions

- 1. Focus Areas: Forest Street Lime Avenue Ash Road• Mere Lane• Fir Lane• Station Road These areas were targeted due to ongoing traffic and parking issues, particularly during school hours.
- 2. Outcomes: Forest Street:• 1 Penalty Notice issued for parking on double yellow lines.
- Lime Avenue: 3 drivers were engaged in conversations and advised to relocate their vehicles to safer locations.
- Ash Road: 1 Penalty Notice issued for parking on zig-zag markings. 1 Penalty Notice issued for crossing double yellow lines.
- Mere Lane: 1 Penalty Notice issued for parking in a disabled bay without displaying a valid badge.
- Fir Lane: Drivers engaged in conversation and advised to relocate to safer parking areas.

Purpose:

This initiative aimed to promote road safety and minimize hazards caused by inappropriate parking, especially in school zones where children are most at risk.

Next Steps:

Ongoing monitoring and further enforcement actions may be implemented to ensure continued compliance and support community safety efforts.

<u>CUDDINGTON – 2 incident (s)</u> - Concerns raised regarding unknown youths smoking unknown substance behind SANDIWAY LIBRARY captured on CCTV. PCSO attended to review footage. Once individual's are identified, they will be spoken to in the presence of a responsible adult. Appropriate referrals will be submitted as necessary. PCSO to patrol location when on duty.

TRUCAM

In Support of the National Road Safety Campaign #FATAL5 speed enforcement has been carried out in the following locations:

- Station Road, Acton Bridge Highest recorded speed: 34mph
- High Street, Weaverham Highest recorded speed: 38mph
- Station Road, Weaverham Highest recorded speed: 40mph.

All 4 offences have been processed and sent to the Central Ticket Office for further action.

Speed enforcement was carried out on Norley Road, Cuddington with the highest recorded speed being 44 mph. Both offences captured will be processed and sent to the Central Ticket Office for further action.

Speed enforcement was carried out on Weaverham Road, Cuddington this week. A total of 9 offences were recorded for exceeding the 30-mph speed limit. All offences have been processed and referred to the Central Ticket Office for further action.

Speed enforcement has been carried out across the Northwich North beat areas. Marbury Ward:


- Marbury Road: highest recorded speed 35mph

PARKING

Following parking concerns raised by our community, a parking patrol was conducted on Church Lane, Weaverham due to unnecessary obstructions affecting drivers' visibility when approaching junctions from Farm Road and Nicholas Road. Several Fixed Penalty Notices were issued and engagement with St Bede's Catholic Church to discuss future preventative measures, including placing cones at the junctions to help ensure clear vision onto Church Lane. PCSO Michelle met with Cheshire West and Chester Councillor Stocks to discuss key local issues and incidents affecting our WEAVER and CUDDINGTON ward. Topics included concerns raised by residents, ongoing safety matters, and the re-establishment of our Community Speed Watch scheme—a vital step in addressing road safety concerns and promoting safer driving in our neighbourhoods.

PCSO Michelle has worked in collaboration with the WVHT Housing Officer this week, carrying out the Street of a Week initiative around ROWAN ROAD, engaging with residents to gather community concerns and feedback. The main issue raised during this initiative was parking, particularly during school hours. Weaverham Parish Council is currently exploring possible solutions to address this ongoing concern. Operation Withdraw: Keeping Northwich Safe - As part of Operation Withdraw, Weaver and Cuddington PC GRIMSHAM and PCSO Michelle have been out in the community conducting checks on taxi drivers. The aim is to ensure all taxis are operating lawfully within the area, helping to keep residents safe while out and about. These proactive checks support public safety by making sure drivers and vehicles are properly licensed and compliant with regulations.

Operation Sceptre returns once again next month (19-25 MAY). The initiative takes place twice a year co-ordinated by the National Police Chief's Council and aims to raise awareness of knife crime, as well as police action in detecting, reducing and preventing it. As part of the Knife Crime Awareness Week, a knife surrender bin will be available at the WEAVER and CUDDINGTON PCSO Surgery, held at The Lighthouse, Church Lane, Weaverham, CW83NJ on Thursday, 22 May, from 18:00 to 19:00 hours. This is an opportunity for members of the community to safely dispose of knives and help make our community safer. I am also planning a knife sweep across our ward on SATURDAY 24TH MAY from 1400 hours for anyone interested in assisting with this safety initiative. Further details to follow in due course.

Engagement took place with PCSO Michelle and members of ST BEDES CATHOLIC CHURCH congregation over coffee after the morning service this week.

PCSO Michelle has also engaged with the farmer who owns the land behind Walnut Avenue, where crops are grown, following concerns about unauthorised access by motorcross bikers and individuals using metal detectors. We kindly remind residents and visitors to respect the farmer's horticultural land, as it is his livelihood and vital to the local community. Further patrols will be conducted in the area to offer reassurance and deter unauthorised access. Thank you for your cooperation.

SAFETY ADVISE

Water Safety Advice – Please Take a Moment to Read

Your safety around water is extremely important. Whether you're at the beach, pool, lake, or river, please keep the following tips in mind:

Always supervise children around water – even shallow areas.

Never swim alone – use the buddy system.

Avoid alcohol when swimming or operating boats.

Wear a life jacket when boating or in open water if you're not a strong swimmer.

Check the weather and water conditions before entering.

Know your limits – don't push yourself too hard.

Learn CPR and basic rescue techniques – it could save a life.
