

You Said: Speed Enforcement on Station Road was a concern

We Did: Station Road, Acton Bridge. 3 offences were captured, with the highest speed recorded at 44 mph. All evidence has been processed by our Central Ticket Office for further action.

You Said: Parking was a concern around FERN WAY and MORRIS DRIVE

We Did: Parking patrols have been conducted across our ward, specifically on Fern Way and

Morris Drive this month.

You Said: Speeding was a concern around DELAMERE PARK and LEIGH WAY

We Did: Speed monitoring/observations has been made several times over the month. One vehicle was captured at 31 mph in a 20 mph on DELAMERE PARK, however the vehicle turned off onto another road before I could obtain the vehicle registration.

CUDDINGTON —2 incident(s)

Multiple reports have been received about 2–3 motorbikes being ridden on farmland in the Weaverham Road area. Patrols have been conducted and will continue as needed. PCSO spoken with local farmers who confirmed that no permission has been granted for motor access to their land.

WEAVERHAM-2 incident(s)

Report of a rider on a moped speeding around Weaverham without a helmet. So far, two electric scooters have been seized within Weaverham and Cuddington by police officers, and patrols will continue to ensure the safety of both the rider and other road users.

Reports received about motorbikes causing a nuisance on farmland behind Walnut Avenue, Weaverham. Patrols have been conducted and will continue as needed. PCSO has spoken directly with the landowner, who confirmed that no motor vehicle access is permitted on his land. This restriction is especially important now, as the farmer is preparing to sow winter cereal seeds (wheat/barley) in the field.

<u>Schools</u>

This week, Key Stage 1 pupils at Cuddington Primary School took part in an interactive session exploring the question: Who are the police? The session included:

Drawing and writing what pupils thought police officers do — both before and after the session to show what they learned.

A discussion about Police Constable (PC) and Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) beat officers.

Please avoid parking in a way that obstructs junctions or footpaths, especially where it prevents pedestrian access or visibility within 10 metres of a junction.



FRAUD warnings





Following on from our recent Fraud awareness days in local banks

I would like to make you aware of a safe, secure and simple way you can contact your bank by calling 159

often when scammers/Fraudsters contact you they will give you a number to call your bank to confirm however this will just put you through to the scammers themselves.

We would advise that you never call any numbers given to you and to check if the call is legitimately from your bank/Building society

instead call 159, NEVER CALL STRAIGHT BACK IF YOU THINK YOU HAVE BEEN SCAMMED AS OFTEN FRAUDSTERS WILL STAY

ON THE LINE AND YOU WILL CONNECT BACK TO THEM, try to use a mobile or wait a minute or 2 before picking the phone up.

If you are at a cash machine and it swallows your card or you notice you have lost your cards instead of waiting until you get home to call the bank do so straight away via **159**.

When you call **159** you will get an automated message asking which bank you require, if you say for example Natwest it will connect you to Natwest securely, below is a clip from money saving expert Martin Lewis explaining how the number works. <u>Martin Lewis: How to call your bank by dialling just three numbers...</u>

I am thrilled to confirm that £2,000 in funding from Cheshire Crimebeat has been approved to support a summer programme aimed at reducing anti-social behaviour and promoting healthy, inclusive outdoor fun for children aged 2–16 across Northwich and Winsford.

What's Included?

Each day will feature a **different activity**, giving children a variety of fun and engaging experiences throughout the summer.

How It Works

10 vouchers will be available per day, each valid for one activity per day on a rolling basis. Vouchers will be issued by Northwich Police, as personal data will be collected for safeguarding and accountability.

Meeting point: Northwich Police Station, where transport will be provided to and from the venue for over 12's (135 cm). Younger children we ask parents to meet us at the venue staying on site. While children enjoy their activities, parents can enjoy several hours of free time in town for shopping or relaxation, then collect their children upon return.

This initiative was developed in response to community feedback and a recent anti-social behaviour incident in **Weaverham**, where youths—unable to afford golf range fees—were playing on open land and accidentally hitting golf balls into nearby properties.

PATROLS

Afternoon Patrol Update - ASB Report Response

Following a report of anti-social behaviour involving motorbikes on farmland within our ward, I conducted a patrol this around Walnut Avenue, Poplar Road, Gorstage Lane, and Weaverham Road. I've spoken with local farmers who confirmed that no permission is granted for motor access to their land. Please respect private property and avoid entering farmland with vehicles.

During the patrol, I also came across fly tipping in a cereal field. This waste needs to be removed urgently as the farmer will be in this field next week sowing winter cereal seeds (wheat/barley).
