

Community Speedwatch

CSW initiative is designed to help manage and reduced speeding in our area. By using speed detection equipment at the roadside, volunteers like you can play a crucial role in making our streets safer.

How It Works -

- Volunteers are trained and supported by the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs).
- You'll use a speed gun to monitor traffic speeds.
- Vehicle details of those exceeding the speed limit are recorded.
- Drivers of speeding vehicles receive warning letters.

Productive joint patrols involving WVHT housing officers in CUDDINGTON and WEAVERHAM have been made providing support to our community.

WEAVER and CUDDINGTON beat team attended DANIELLE ASHLEY'S activities session to discuss future engagement opportunities. During their visit, they engaged with service users, talking about the Aurora Borealis that was visible over WEAVERHAM last month.

Engagement with the faith community at ACTON BRIDGE Baptist church 'harvest festival' was made by your beat team. Thank you all for your engagement.

Further to the above, CWAC Cllr Gillian EDWARDS and WEAVER and CUDDINGTON beat team took proactive steps to address the parking issues on MILTON ROUGH collaborating with the faith community at ACTON BRIDGE Baptist church to find solutions for safer parking.

CWAC Cllr EDWARDS will further engage with our community for volunteers to expand the sidewalk footpath (removing overgrown grass) and explore options with ACTION BRIDGE parish council for funding creating additional parking spaces with reinforced mesh to help ease congestion.

Super cocooning has been conducted in response to a recent burglary at FOREST CLOSE CUDDINGTON and distribution of security leaflets, along with Neighbourhood Watch and Resident Voice survey leaflets. For more information see links attached -

Community Notice: Criminal Damage in WEAVERHAM

We are aware of a recent spate of criminal damage to vehicles and incidents where recycling bins or other bins have been tipped over, spilling contents onto the floor. Most incidents have occurred on WEDNESDAY evenings, after residents have put their bins out for collection which have been reported to the WEAVER and CUDDINGTON Beat Team. As a community, we ask you to be extra vigilant, particularly on WEDNESDAY evenings. Let's work together to keep our neighbourhood safe.

Mischief Night was relatively controlled, but Halloween itself saw a spike in anti-social behaviour (ASB) in Cuddington and Weaverham. Officers will work with local schools to identify those involved as a preventive measure to discourage further incidents.

Unfortunately, we have received another 2 reports over the Halloween period for vehicles being damaged. Please rest assured, we are fully committed to identifying those responsible and addressing this issue. PARKING

School parking patrol have been carried out across your ward to enhance the safety of children (Weaverham High School, Weaverham Academy, St Bedes primary school). Further patrols with partner agencies have been arranged.

Parking concerns around MORRIS DRIVE and ST BEDES AVENUE have been addressed, several advisory notices issued to vehicles parked on the junctions. Further patrols will be made.

Parking patrol across our ward to address community concerns around ACTON BRIDGE Baptist and ST BEDES catholic church. I am pleased to report all parking observed was in order. Further patrols will continue when on duty to provide reassurance to all.

CWAC enforcement officers have actively addressed our community's concerns about parking issues within the ward this weekend. Penalty charge notices were issued to promote safer and more considerate parking practices. Positive feedback from public engagement was received highlighting the community's appreciation for taking these steps. Engagement made with residents through face-to-face CCTV enquiries. Over 165 survey leaflets provided, with a QR code for convenient completion via mobile camera.

SAFEGUARDING

The Herbert Protocol is a safeguarding measure designed to help locate and protect vulnerable individuals, particularly those with dementia, in the event they go missing. It involves gathering detailed personal information, including medical history, a photograph, and details of places the person may be familiar with, to assist the police and community in finding them quickly and safely.

This proactive approach can be crucial in ensuring the safety and well being of those living with dementia.

If you know someone who could benefit from having a Herbert Protocol form completed, especially if they are living with dementia or another condition that makes them vulnerable to going missing , contact your PCSO for assistance to complete -

Did you see the recent alert sent by our Crime Prevention Team? The alert included lots of advice about personal safety, which I have summarised below:

- 1. When going out you should always plan how you are going to get home.
- 2. Prepare for your day before you leave and consider what you might need. Phone, money etc.
- 3. Update someone on your plans and always make sure someone is aware of where you are.
- 4. Plan your journey. Google street view is useful for identifying places in an unknown area before you set off.
- 5. When it gets dark, keep to busy, well-lit streets, walkways and paths.
- 6. Be aware when using cash point machines. If there are signs of tampering or people acting suspiciously, do not use it.
- 7. Try not to keep all your valuables in one place.

- 8. Only take licensed taxis or minicabs booked by phone or a mobile phone app.
- 9. Installing an app such as <u>Hollie Guard Personal Safety App</u> on your smart phone or consider carrying a personal alarm.
- 10. Confidence you are less likely to be targeted if you look confident.

If you haven't already, please share this or the crime prevention alert with friends, family, and neighbours. As always, thanks for your continued support.

FRAUD

Please remember, the police will never ask you for any financial or private information. If you receive contact from someone claiming to be a police officer and they request this type of information, it is a scam. Do not provide any personal details. Instead, report the incident by calling 101. Stay vigilant and protect yourself from fraud.
