YOUTHS CAUTIONED DUE TO CAUSING ANTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR ISSUES

Over the past few weeks PC LOCK and PCSO ROBERTSON have been dealing with a number of issues involving youths, which involve :

- Setting fires
- Shop lifting
- Knock and Run Incidents

All of the above incidents were reporting by members of the public , which enabled PC LOCK / PCSO ROBERTSON to use CCTV / VIDEO FOOTAGE of the incidents and gain an identification .

To gain identification we first see if any member of NORTHWICH POLICE know them, if not then as it has been reported we can ask our partners at schools. (this is the reason why it is important to report issues, as we CAN NOT show CCTV / VIDEO footage to outside sources if incidents are not reported)

In all of the above issues , all reported incidents were successful in obtaining positive IDs.

PC LOCK / PCSO ROBERTSON then conducted house visits to all of those involved and talks to all involved with parents present to discuss :

- The reason for their behaviour
- The impact on the victims
- The impact on others
- They have to take responsibility of their actions / even if they were NOT directly involved. Even if they were part of the group and stood by and allowed the incident to take place, they are just as guilty.

All home visits were successful in terms of having a parents presence and their support.

All youths that were involved were given COMMUNITY RESOLUTIONS which therefore meant if they were involved in any other issues of this, then they would be interviewed under caution at NORTHWICH POLICE STATION.

ASB AREAS HAVE CCTV

Over the past couple of years, PCSO ROBERTSON together with reports to 101 has identified ASB HOTSPOTS (areas which have a number of ASB issues). And with help of PARISH COUNCILS and NORTHWICH TOWN COUNCIL, these areas now have CCTV. So if there are issues of ASB we can use these cameras to gain footage of the incident.

Its not just CCTV that we can use , with the rise of RING DOOR CAMERSA being used , we can use footage from them , which can be emailed to PCSO ROBERTSON, which actually help with one of the incidents above.



WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Further reports regarding suspicious activity regarding a neighbour storing fuel and placing fuel into his vehicle—WEAVER VALE are aware of this and are dealing with this as the only issue is the storage of it.
- Reports in regards to youths causing possible Anti Social Behviour issues outside reporting persons window— CCTV is being requested by PCSO and will be contacted GREAT PLACES if there is an issue being caused by these youths
- Report from a third party due to a welfare of a female—**RESPONSE officers attended the females** address and spoke to her, no cause for concern
- Report of a male being aggressive after children being shouted at due to them coming onto his driveway with scooters—**RESPONSE OFFICERS spoke to reporting person**
- Report of a female injurying herself with a knife—RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched and AMBULANCE called—female sent to hospital

LEFTWICH

ASB / CAUSED FOR CONCERN

- Report of a neighbour sticking fingers up at reporting persons daughter—Ongoing neighbour issue in which PC LOCK and PCSO ROBERTSON are looking into
- Further reports of youths breaking into LEFTWICH COMMUNITY BUILDING—PCSO is in touch with CHESHIRE WEST AND CHESTER COUNCIL in regards to boarding up. Patrols are occurring.
- Report over cause of concern due to past incidents that have occurring with the family. Email was sent to reporting person who has raised it with police—**RESPONSE attended and spoke to all concerned** and there is no cause for concern
- Report in regards to on-going Neighbour dispute— ongoing issue in which partner agencies are involved and looking into solving this issue
- Report of a downstairs neighbour shouting and banging into the early hours—PCSO has conducted reassurance call and advised Reporting Person to download the NOISE APP so COUNCIL can get involved.
- Report of suspicious items being sent through the post to the Reporting person, 3 weird items all being sent to the same address on different days—**PCSO Robertson to call for reassurance**
- Further reports of youths gaining access to LEFTWICH COMMUNITY BUILDING—PCSO ROBERTSON is in contact with CWAC to ensure they secure the building as it is a CWAC owned building.
- Report of concern due to female being distressed, as there is screaming and shouting coming from the address—RESPONSE officers attended and spoke to the female, with partner agencies being involved. Parent was spoken to and therefore no cause for alarm
- Report of a loose possible dangerous dog in a neighbours garden—**Reporting person was advised** that not a police matter if there has been no issue with the dog, this is a CWAC issue
- Report of a large gathering in a house and causing a disturbance to neighbours— **RESPONSE officers** attended and advised of the issues that they are causing
- Further report in relation to the large gathering , that one male is "KICKING OFF" **RESONSE OFFICERS were dispatched**
- Report of youths gaining access to LEFTWICH COMMUNITY BUILDING and carrying out chairs— **RESPONSE officers attended**, youths not in area and access points boarded up
- Report of a large group of youths playing and making a huge noise in the early hours of the morning on OLD HALL ROAD PLAYING PARK—**RESPONSE OFFICERS dispatched—area searched no trace**
- Report of a group of youths causing issues around the shops on CLIFTON DRIVE—**RESPONSE** OFFICERS attended and spoke to the youths involved

HIGHWAY OBSTRUCTIONS

• Report of a driveway being block—RESPONSE officers attended and there was no blockage , but vehicle was parked close to driveway

LEFTWICH (Continued)

THEFT OF A MOTOR VEHCILE

• Report of a theft of motor vehicle after reporting person dropped his keys whilst walking dog -CRIMED

KINGSMEAD

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of a historical assault by a neighbour.-RESPONSE officers are looking into this
- Report from a school in regards to a social media post that has stated a families address who are vulnerable—**RESPONSE have tried to call all parties but have been unsuccessful.**
- Report of a disturbance in the park at the end of DUKES WAY, reporting person wants to remain ANON as no reporting person details PCSO ROBERTSON can not do a REASSURANCE VISIT, but will place this onto SUMMER ASB PATROL PLAN

THEFT

Report of waste oil being stolen from the KINGFISHER Pub—Has been crimed

DAVENHAM

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of a female threatening to kill herself as she has ran away from her family—RESPONSE attended and there was no cause for concern. Located the female and spoke to all parties, female was frustrated and tired and just wanted to go home
- Report of a female knocking on reporting persons door and asking for her relatives, female confused and didn't know where she was—**RESPONSE officers attended and after checks complete found out her home address and took the female back and spoke to husband in regards to this**
- Report of noise coming from BUTCHERS STILE at 2230—Safeguarding advice given and has been logged with BEAT TEAM

MOULTON

ASB / CAUSE FOR CONCERN

- Report of reporting persons fence being damaged by neighbour— **RESPONSE OFFICERS have spoken to** reporting person
- Report of a neighbour dispute in regards to a fence in relation to above. Words have been exchanged and items have been thrown at the Reporting Person—RESPONSE officer has attended and spoke to reporting person, could not get in touch with other neighbour. PCSO will call for reassurance and to try and get in touch with other party.
- Report of verbal arguments and threats due to allegations of one party dropping litter— **RESPONSE OFFIC-ERS have spoken to all parties involved**

WEAVER HALL / ROSE MEADOW

- More Patrols in area as there is ASB issues
- Safeguarding people from social media bullying—Safe guarding advice has been provided on our Social Media Channels
 and to people who bring it to our attention

LEFTWICH

- Speed Monitoring on CLIFTON DRIVE / DUNHAM ROAD / LONDON ROAD (30MPH SECTION) and LIME AVE
- More Visibility around WOODPECKER DRIVE area / GRANVILLE ROAD area
- Extend the school parking patrols to WOODSIDE TERRACE area is now included in the school parking patrols
- Issues with OFF ROAD BIKES— Owner of the BIKE has been spoken to and warned if witnessed again, bike may be seized
- More PATROLS around the play parks due to ASB— latest incident being looked into 3 female youths have been identified and house visits will be conducted.
- More patrols around the shops due to ASB issues (NEW) CLIFTON DRIVE is included in the SUMMER ASB PATROLS that PCSO ROBERTSON is conducting

KINGSMEAD

- Parking patrols on REGENCY WAY just after the ROUNDABOUT— Parking patrols have been conducted by MINI POLICE
- Speed Monitoring on REGENCY WAY and DUKES WAY
- School Parking patrols extend to MONARCH DRIVE—Now included in the school parking patrol
- More Patrols around REGENCY WAY RETAIL PARK
- Littering from the students that attend SIR JOHN DEANES
- Anti Social Behaviour issues around the community
- Parking patrols around WYNDHAM CLOSE— Parking patrols will be conducted at the start of term in SEPTEMBER

DAVENHAM

- Speed Monitoring on MOUNT PLEASANT / FOUNTAIN LANE / LONDON ROAD (20 MPH SECTION) / HARTFORD ROAD) and CHURCH ROAD at commuter times
- Provide events / things to do for the youths in the community—Football sessions have been set up in AUGUST
- More Parking patrols around the area
- Issues with OFF ROAD BIKES / ELECTRIC SCOOTERS around JACK LANE—One electric scooter has been seized with the community
- Parking issues around THE PAVILLIONS junction of HARTFORD ROAD / EATON LANE— FIXED PENALTY TICKETS have been issued to those vehicles that cause issues
- Bring up issues relating to CANNANBIS to WEAVER VALE—Are in touch with WEAVER VALE and will raise this up again
- Parking Issues at the top of CHURCH ROAD / junction of LONDON ROAD—Vehicles that have been witnessed causing issues (which mainly are linked to parking on double yellow lines to attend the pharmacy) will be issued FIXED PENALTY TICKETS
- Parking on LONDON ROAD and LABURNUM ROAD—Any issues witnessed on LONDON ROAD will be issued with FIXED PENALTY TICKETS as it's the main road PCSO ROBERTSON uses to get to MOULTON. So LONDON ROAD is being patrolled. LABURNUM ROAD is a private road so parking can not be addressed.



SCHOOL / COLLEGE PARKING — (80 Vehicles causing issues between SEP 23— JULY 24)

Over the past school year over 80 vehicles were given even VERBAL advisories (IF DRIVERS PRESENT) or FIXED PENALTY TICKETS, this also includes patrols conducted by the MINI POLICE.

KINGSMEAD— 55 issues (including MINI POLICE patrols)

Including , parking infront of residents driveways , parking on double yellow lines and parking over the footpath crossing

DAVENHAM— 12 issues

Including parking too close to junctions, parking over residents driveways

LEFTWICH— 10 issues

Including parking too close to junctions , on the keep clear sections , parking across residents driveways

MOULTON—3 issues

Including parking on double yellows , too close to junctions , on keep clear sections

Going into the 24/25 year any issues will be issued Fixed penalty tickets unless driver is present



KINGSMEAD MINI POLICE—JULY

MINI POLICE TEACH ROAD SAFETY

Having completed the CHESTER WEST AND CHESTER LETS WALK program (green cross code , crossing roads safely) last month. The MINI POLICE taught what they learnt to children from year 4.

A selection of Mini Police officers was selected to teach students from year. As this was the first time that Mini Police was being the instructors, a selection of year 4 students were picked.

So together with 15 students from year 4, the Mini Police together with PCSO ROBERTSON, PCSO HAMBLETON and PCSO DONNELLY completed the 60 minute session.

In this session the Mini Police spoke about :

- best places to cross the road
- How to cross the road when there are parked cars
- How to cross the road near a junction
- How to cross a busy road
- What not to do when crossing the road

All students who completed the training where given a

LETS WALK TRAINING CERTIFICATE by the Mini Police. And this is going to be a regular activity that the Mini Police will complete in KINGSMEAD.

THE SPEED GUNS ARE OUT

One of the most requested activities that the MINI POLICE wanted to conduct was the SPEED GUN. This past month the MINI POLICE were trained on how to use the TRU CAM SPEED GUN and where out on the A533 (KINGSMEAD) due to residents concerns of speeding.

The entire Mini Police force completed speed gun sessions from 11:00—15:00.

In this time there were 2 offences captured with the highest speed being 47 MPH

Northwich police warn youths over anti-social behaviour

YOUTHS could be arrested if they continue to get involved in antisocial behaviour, police have warned.

Police officers in Davenham and Moulton have taken action following a spate of antisocial incidents.

A number of issues were reported to the local police team, including criminal damage, shoplifting and knock-and-run incidents.

CCTV of the incidents was handed over to police and, with help from partners, police have managed to identify all of those involved.

PCSO Lee Robertson and PC Tom Lock have conducted house visits and spoken to the youths and their parents.

Each of the youths has been handed a community resolution order and warned that further issues will result in them being arrested and having to attend Northwich Police Station for an interview under caution.

A spokesperson for the force said: "Please be assured anti-social behaviour will not be tolerated within our community and patrols will increase in those areas that have had previous issues."
