

News Stories from your local area



Male arrested and charged with handling stolen goods.

Dale SIMPSON, 32yrs, appeared at Crewe Magistrates Court, pleading guilty to two counts of Handling Stolen Goods in Appleton and Runcorn.

He has was sentenced to 20 weeks imprisonment, suspended for a period of 24 months and to compensate the victim for their loss to the value of £3,830.





Operation Scrambler

This time of year we usually see a rise in illegal off road bike activity. Operation Scrambler is currently active and we urge any member of the public that sees illegal off road bike activity to report it to us either via 101 or the report an incident feature on our website:

One of the most successful ways of tackling this issue is to locate where the bikes are being stored and who is riding them, this enables us to deal with the problem before the bike gets mobile and puts the public and other road users at risk. Whilst at an address in Stockton Heath, officers identified a high value mountain bike which was stolen from a shed break in Runcorn in October 2020.

We were able to identify the bike a stolen by using the Bike Register app. Keep an eye on Social media and Cheshire Alert for any upcoming bike marking events.



Rogue traders

Rogue traders have been cold calling at addresses across the south, trying to sell goods. Those involved will tell you they are working as part of a offender rehabilitation scheme- there is no such scheme.

Please consider the following advice regarding potential bogus callers:

- Use the door chain (if you have one) before opening the door.
- Ask the caller for identification and check it carefully
- Never feel pressured into buying any goods or services
- Please report any suspicious activity on 101 in a non-emergency. In an emergency please dial 999.



Operation Shield.

As part of our ongoing work to deter people from committing crime in Cheshire, we have invested in forensic property marking kits to identify those responsible for theft- known as **Operation Shield.**

Local PCSOs will be visiting homes across the area over

the coming months to deliver the DNA kits to residents as part of their street a week home visits. As part of any on going burglary investigation, PCSOs will also be visiting streets where burglaries have been reported to Cheshire Police to offer crime prevention advice to neighbouring properties and to provide DNA kits to the residents of these streets.

Internet safety Day 2022

The internet opens up a wide variety of experiences and opportunities to learn, share, connect with friends and take part in online games for everyone including young people. However there are concerns about the possible threats to children and young people's safety that can exist online. 8th February was internet safety day.

To support internet safety day, local PCSOs attended primary schools across the area to talk to the pupils about how they can follow a few simple steps to ensure they are safe whilst online.
